Notice is hereby given that the Annual General Meeting of shareholders of Sacgasco Limited ("**Company**") will be held at 12 pm (AWST) on Tuesday, 31 May 2022, at Level 1, 31 Cliff Street, Fremantle, Western Australia.

In order to determine voting entitlements, the register of Shareholders will be closed at 4:00 pm (AWST) on 29 May 2022.

An Explanatory Statement containing information in relation to each of the Resolutions to be put to the meeting accompanies this Notice.

Financial Statements and Reports

To receive and consider the annual financial report for the Company for the financial year ended 31 December 2021 together with the declaration of the Directors, the Director's Report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

Ordinary Resolution 1: Adoption of the Remuneration Report

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as a **non-binding resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given for the adoption of the Remuneration Report contained within the Company's annual financial report for the financial year ended 31 December 2021."

Note 1: The vote on this resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors of the Company.

Note 2: If 25% or more of votes that are cast are voted against the adoption of the Remuneration Report at two consecutive annual general meetings, Shareholders will be required to vote at the second of those annual general meetings on a resolution (a "spill resolution") at another meeting to be held within 90 days at which all of the Company's Directors (other than the Managing Director and CEO) must stand for re-election. Less than 25% of shareholders voted against the remuneration report at the 2021 Annual General Meeting.

Voting Prohibition Statement:

A vote on this Resolution 1 must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of any of the following persons:

- (a) a member of the Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report; or
- (b) a Closely Related Party of such a member.

(collectively, a "**Prohibited Voter**").

However, a Prohibited Voter may cast a vote on this Resolution 1 as a proxy if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person described above and either:

- (a) the Prohibited Voter is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on the Resolution; or
- (b) the Prohibited Voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy:
 - (i) does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; and

- (ii) expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even if the Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel for the Company, or if the Company is part of a consolidated entity, for the entity.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement is intended to provide Shareholders with sufficient information to assess the merits of the Resolutions contained in the accompanying Notice of Annual General Meeting (**Notice**) of the Company.

The Directors of the Company (**Directors**) recommend Shareholders read this Explanatory Statement in full before making any decision in relation to the Resolutions.

The following information should be noted in respect of the various matters contained in the accompanying Notice.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

The business of the Annual General Meeting will include receipt and consideration of the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 31 December 2021, together with the declaration of the Directors, the Directors' report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

A copy of the Company's 2021 Annual Report is available on the Company's ASX platform (**ASX:SGC**) and on the website www.sacgasco.com. Alternatively, a hard copy will be made available upon request.

The Company's auditor, HLB Mann Judd, will be present at the Annual General Meeting and Shareholders will have the opportunity to ask the auditor questions in relation to the conduct of the audit, the auditor's report, the Company's accounting policies, and the independence of the auditor.

In addition to taking questions at the Meeting, written questions to the Chair about the management of the Company, or to the Company's auditor about:

- (a) the preparation and content of the auditor's report;
- (b) the conduct of the audit;
- (c) accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of the Annual Financial Statements; and
- (d) the independence of the auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit,

may be submitted no later than 5 business days before the meeting date to the Company Secretary.

ORDINARY RESOLUTION 1: Adoption of Remuneration Report

General

The Corporations Act requires that at a listed company's Annual General Meeting, a resolution that the Remuneration Report be adopted must be put to the Shareholders. However, such a resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

The Remuneration Report sets out the Company's remuneration arrangements for the Directors and senior management of the Company. The Remuneration Report is part of the Directors' report contained in the annual financial report of the Company for a financial year.

The chair of the meeting must allow a reasonable opportunity for its shareholders to ask questions about or make comments on the Remuneration Report at the Annual General Meeting.

Voting consequences

Under changes to the Corporations Act which came into effect on 1 July 2011, a company is required to put to its shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of shareholders to consider the

appointment of directors of the company (Spill Resolution) if, at consecutive annual general meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on a remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report and at the first of those annual general meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those annual general meetings.

If more than 50% of votes cast are in favour of the Spill Resolution, the company must convene a shareholder meeting (Spill Meeting) within 90 days of the second annual general meeting.

All of the Directors of the Company who were in office when the Directors' report (as included in the Company's annual financial report for the most recent financial year) was approved, other than the Managing Director of the Company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting.

Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as Directors of the company is approved will be the Directors of the Company.

Previous voting results

At the Company's previous Annual General Meeting, the votes cast against the remuneration report considered at that annual general meeting were less than 25%. Accordingly, the Spill Resolution is not relevant for this Annual General Meeting.

Proxy restrictions

Shareholders appointing a proxy for Resolution 1 should note the following:

(a) ***If you appoint a member of the Key Management Personnel (other than the Chair) as your proxy***

If you elect to appoint a member of the Key Management Personnel (other than the Chair) whose remuneration details are included in the Remuneration Report, or a Closely Related Party of that member, ***you must direct the proxy how they are to vote***. Undirected proxies granted to these persons will not be voted and will not be counted in calculating the required majority if a poll is called on this Resolution.

(b) ***If you appoint the Chair as your proxy***

If you elect to appoint the Chair where he/ she is also a member of the Key Management Personnel whose remunerations details are included in the Remuneration Report, or a Closely Related Party of such a member, ***you must direct the Chair how they are to vote***. (c) ***If you appoint any other person as your proxy***

You ***do not*** need to direct your proxy how to vote, and you ***do not*** need to tick any further acknowledgement on the Proxy Form. Undirected proxies granted to these persons will be voted at their discretion.

ORDINARY RESOLUTION 2: Re-election of Director – William Ashby

ASX Listing Rule 14.4 provides that a Director of an entity must not hold office (without re-election) past the third Annual General Meeting following the Director's appointment or 3 years, whichever is longer. However, a director appointed to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the board must not hold office (without re-election) past the next annual general meeting of the entity.

Clause 14.4 of the Company's Constitution requires that a Director appointed by the Board will hold office only until the next annual general meeting and is then eligible for re-election. If Resolution 9 is passed, the Issue will be excluded in calculating Sacgasco's 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively increasing the number of equity securities it can issue without shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the Issue Date.

If Resolution 9 is not passed, the Issues will be included in calculating Sacgasco's 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities it can issue without shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the Issue Date.

If Resolution 10 is passed, the Issue will be excluded in calculating Sacgasco's 10% limit in Listing Rule 7.1A, effectively increasing the number of equity securities it can issue without shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the Issue Date.

If Resolution 10 is not passed, the Issues will be included in calculating Sacgasco's 10% limit in Listing Rule 7.1A, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities it can issue without shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the Issue Date.

ORDINARY RESOLUTION 11: Approval of Issue of Director Shares – Ms Joanne Kendrick

As of her resignation date, 6 April 2022, Ms Joanne Kendrick was owed \$68,310 in fees. The fees had been elected to be deferred to focus working capital on production and exploration operations in the near term until a partial settlement via share issuance was able to be approved by shareholders.

The Directors resolved on 13 April 2022, subject to shareholder approval, to issue 1,404,960 fully paid ordinary shares to Ms Kendrick at a deemed issue price of \$0.033 per share (consistent with deemed issue prices utilised for quarterly Director share issuances in calendar 2021) as partial extinguishment (\$46,785) of the liability owed.

For a public company to give a financial benefit to a related party of the company, the public company or entity must:

- (a) obtain the approval of the public company's members in the manner set out in Section 217 to 227 of the *Corporations Act 2001* (Cth); and
- (b) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval,

unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in Sections 210 to 216 of the *Corporations Act 2001* (Cth).

Notwithstanding that Ms Kendrick is considered a related party, by virtue of having been a Director of the Company within the previous 6 months, the other Directors consider that the issuance of Director Shares, on the same terms as shares issued to Directors for quarterly director fee settlement, as partial extinguishment of an existing liability constitutes an arm's length transaction under Section 210 of the *Corporations Act 2001* (Cth).

In addition, ASX Listing Rule 10.11 requires shareholder approval be obtained where an entity issues, or agrees to issue, securities to a Related Party (or a person who has been a Related Party in the last 6 months), or a person whose relationship with the entity or a Related Party is, in ASX's opinion, such that approval should be obtained unless an exception in Listing Rule 10.12 applies. Accordingly, Shareholder approval is sought for the issuance of Director Shares to the Related Party as partial extinguishment of an existing liability.

Shareholder Approval – ASX Listing Rule 10.11

Pursuant to, and in accordance with, the requirements of ASX Listing Rule 10.13, the following information is provided in relation to the proposed issuance of Director Shares:

- (a) the Related Party is Ms Joanne Kendrick as identified under ASX Listing Rule 10.11.1 by virtue of being a Director of the Company within the past 6 months;

- (b) Ms Kendrick received Directors fees totalling \$36,000 per annum;
- (c) the maximum number of Director Shares to be issued to the Related Party is 1,404,960 Director Shares;
- (d) the Director Shares will be issued no later than 1 month after the date of the Meeting (or such later date to the extent permitted by any ASX waiver of modification of the ASX Listing Rules);
- (e) the Directors Shares will be issued for a deemed issue price of \$0.033 per share;
- (f) the Director Shares will rank parri passu with the Company's existing shares; and
- (g) the Director Shares will be granted as partial extinguishment of existing liability owed to the Director and accordingly no funds will be raised.

Approval pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 is not required in order to issue the Director Shares to the Related Party as approval is being obtained under Listing Rule 10.11. Accordingly, the issue of Director Shares to the Related Party will not be included in the 15% calculation of the Company's annual placement capacity pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1.

Sacgasco is proposing to issue shares to the Director in satisfaction of fees owing (the "**Issue**").

Listing Rule 10.11 provides that unless one of the exceptions in Listing Rule 10.12 applies, a listed company must not issue or agree to issue equity securities to;

- 10.11.1 a related party;
- 10.11.2 a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (30%+) holder in the company;
- 10.11.3 a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (10%+) holder in the company and who has nominated a director to the board of the company pursuant to a relevant agreement which gives them a right or expectation to do so;
- 10.11.4 an associated of a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.11.1 to 10.11.3; or
- 10.11.5 a person whose relationship with the company or a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.11.1 to 10.11.4 is such that, in ASX's opinion, the issue or agreement should be approved by its shareholders,

unless it obtains the approval of its shareholders.

The issue falls within Listing Rule 10.11.1 and does not fall within any of the exceptions in Listing Rule 10.12. It therefore requires the approval of Sacgasco's shareholders under Listing Rule 10.11.

Resolution 11 seeks the required shareholder approval to the Issue under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 10.11.

If Resolution 11 is passed, Sacgasco will be able to proceed with the Issue and reduce the fees owing to the Director by \$46,785.

If Resolution 11 is not passed, Sacgasco will not be able to proceed with the Issue and the debt of \$46,785 owing to the Director will remain for settlement via cash.

ORDINARY RESOLUTIONS 12-14: Approval to Issue Shares to Directors under Incentive Share Plan

ASX Listing Rule 10.11 requires Shareholder approval to be obtained where an entity issues, or agrees to issue, securities to a related party, or person whose relationship with the entity or a related party is, in ASX's opinion, such that approval should be obtained unless an exception in ASX Listing Rule 10.12 applies.

An exception to ASX Rule 10.11 is set out in ASX Listing Rule 10.12 (*Exception 8*) which provides that ASX Listing Rule 10.11 does not apply to issue made with the approval of Shareholders under ASX Listing Rule 10.14.

ASX Listing Rule 10.14 provides that an entity must not permit any of the following parties to acquire equity securities under an employee incentive scheme without the approval of the holders of its ordinary securities:

- (a) A Director of the entity;
- (b) An associate of a Director of the entity; or
- (c) A person whose relationship with the entity, a Director or an associate of a Director is such that, in ASX's opinion, the acquisition should be approved by security holders.

The Company is able to issue Shares under its Share Plan (**Plan Shares**) to eligible participants over a period of 3 years (commencing July 2020) without impacting on the Company's ability to issue up to 15% of its total ordinary securities without Shareholder approval in any 12 month period. The Listing Rules require, however, that specific approval be obtained for the issue of shares to Directors. A summary of the terms of the Share Plan is included in Appendix 3.

Messrs Jeffery, Childs and Ashby, Directors of the Company, have agreed, subject to shareholder approval, to have the option, at their election, of receiving shares for 50% of their Director's fees. Based on current fees payable as required under ASX Listing Rule 10.15.4, each Director would receive shares for the following level of fees per annum:

The Company has however set a minimum cap on the deemed issue price, being not less than \$0.015. Therefore, the maximum number of Plan Shares the related parties could receive in aggregate in the period up to 12 months from the date of this meeting would be no more than 10,666,667 Plan Shares as follows:

Should Messrs Jeffery, Childs or Ashby elect not to receive Shares in lieu of cash salary, they will be remunerated by means of cash payment.

If Resolutions 12 to 14 are passed, the Company will be able to issue Shares under the Share Plan to Messrs Jeffery, Childs and Ashby without impacting on the Company's ability to issue up to 15% of its total ordinary securities without Shareholder approval.

If Resolutions 12 to 14 are not passed, the Company will not be able to issue Shares under the Share Plan (Plan Shares) to Messrs Jeffery, Childs and Ashby and the amount owing for Directors fees will remain for settlement via cash as and when the entity is capable of payment.

Details of any securities issued under the scheme will be published in the annual report of the entity relating to the period in which they were issued, along with a statement that approval for the issue was obtained under ASX Listing Rule 10.14.

For a public company to give a financial benefit to a related party of the public company, the public company or entity must:

- (a) obtain the approval of the public company's members in the manner set out in Section 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act; and
- (b) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval,

unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in Sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act.

The grant of the Director Options constitutes giving a financial benefit, and Messrs Jeffery, Childs and Ashby are Related Parties of the Company by virtue of being Directors.

In addition, Listing Rule 10.11 also requires shareholder approval to be obtained where an entity issues, or agrees to issue, securities to a related party or a person whose relationship with the entity or a related party is, in ASX's opinion, such that approval should be obtained unless an exception in Listing Rule 10.12 applies. It is the view of the Directors that the exceptions set out in Sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act and Listing Rule 10.12 do not apply in the current circumstances. Accordingly, Shareholder approval is sought for the grant of Director Options to the Related Parties.

Shareholder Approval (Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act and Listing Rule 10.11)

Pursuant to, and in accordance with, the requirements of Sections 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act and Listing Rule 10.13, the following information is provided in relation to the proposed grant of Director Options:

- (a) the Related Parties are Gary Jeffery, Andrew Childs and William Ashby as identified under ASX Listing Rule 10.11.1 by virtue of being Directors.

- (b) the maximum number of Director Options (being the nature of the financial benefit being provided) to be granted to the Related Parties is 20,000,000;
- (c) The Director Options will be exercisable at 4.5 cents per Option on or before 31 January 2024, on terms and conditions as reflected in Appendix 1 to this notice;
- (d) the Director Options will be granted to the Related Parties no later than 1 month after the date of the General Meeting (or such later date as permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the ASX Listing Rules) and it is anticipated the Director Options will be issued on one date;
- (e) the Director Options will be granted for nil cash consideration; accordingly, no funds will be raised;

If Shareholders approve Resolution 19, the number of Equity Securities the Eligible Entity may issue under the 10% Placement Capacity will be determined in accordance with the formula prescribed in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2 (as set out below).

- (g) The calculations above do not show the dilution that any one particular Shareholder will be subject to. All Shareholders should consider the dilution caused to their own shareholding depending on their specific circumstances; and
